Br. John: Francis adopted the Tau as his symbol for willingness to be in continuous conversion of heart. Francis told his brothers that their religious habit was the same shape as the Tau, meaning, that they were called to be "walking crucifixes," models of a compassionate God, and examples of faithfulness until their dying days.
