Pope Francis' Laudate Deum Pope Francis released his new Apostolic Exhortation today, on the feast of St. Francis. I just finished reading it. It has the spiritual, theological, and scientific weight of Laudato Si, while stating more concisely and plainly that the climate crisis calls for urgent action to reduce the use of fossil fuels. The Holy Father is telling us, we must meet the challenge of this moment. Much is happening, but much too slowly. You can read Laudate Deum at this link.
