## Raising Hope Conference for the tenth anniversary of Laudato Si

On October 1, His Holiness Pope Leo XIV led a moving celebration of hope for our common home. It was a kickoff for the conference to follow. When he blessed the water of the glacial ice block, it was very emotional for me, and I doubt if I'm the only person for whom that act unlocked a lifetime of tears over the disappearing glaciers and what it's meant to Sister Mother Earth. Pope Leo, an Augustinian, was, like Pope Francis, tuned in to Franciscan thinking as it applies to this moment in history. Also, Adeniké Adewale sang a beautiful short line from the Canticle in Italian: Laudato sie, mi Signore cum tucte le Tue creature, which became a theme for the conference. On October 2, 3, Leaders from the realms of faith, justice movements, science, and policy reflected on the impact of *Laudato Si'* and the most effective actions we can take now. This three-day event was designed to animate hope and joy around the movement of *Laudato Si* at its tenth
