Franciscan ministries seek to integrate the charism and value system of Francis and Clare of Assisi into organizational culture and decision-making. This program is dedicated to helping new and prospective mission officers translate the wisdom of Franciscan founders in today's complex organizations.

The program is **co-sponsored by The Sisters of St. Francis of the Neumann Communities and the Franciscan Institute at St. Bonaventure University**. It will transpire over an 18-month period and include two 3-day workshops and a series of group and individual tutorials between the two residential seminars.

PROGRAM

The Form and Function of Successful Mission Offices

Participants will study the increasing importance of the role of the mission officer and the development of engagement in the core mission at all levels of the organization. Where are models found and what resources are available for sustaining excellence in leading this effort?

Franciscan Foundations for Mission Integration and Organizational Vitality

Application of the Franciscan value system in the context of contemporary challenges in the workplace will be a central theme. How do we link the founding vision of the first Franciscans with modern cultures? An overview of the Franciscan intellectual tradition that demonstrates practical impacts in dealing with economic and other ethical dilemmas will be included.

Catholic Identity: Issues and Inspirations.

The founding stories relate how Francis and Clare navigated relationships with the Church, its leaders and its emerging needs. How do Franciscans work within the Catholic Church while engaging in inter-religious outreach and functioning in a highly secularized culture.

Pauline J. Albert, Ph.D. is the program curriculum director. A former corporate executive, she is a writer, researcher, teacher and organization development specialist. Dr. Albert is known for her research on Francis and Clare as sources of insight for new paradigms of leadership.
